SEAFDEC/NOAA Capacity Building Workshop on EAFM Management Tools 20-24 July 2020, Thailand

Background

The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and IMA International, with technical assistance from several consultants, formed a consortium to develop an Essential Ecosystem to Fisheries Management (E-EAFM) training course in 2012. The Consortium was supported by a number of organizations, projects and donors. The course was officially handed over to the Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center (SEAFDEC) to be implemented through its training department (TD) soon after its completion. SEAFDEC has used the course extensively in Southeast Asia, while other agencies have facilitated the course in South Asia, Latin America and Africa.

More recently, NOAA has been collaborating with the SEAFDEC to build capacity of SEAFDEC TD in providing training and implementation of EAFM. Main activities to date have been:

- A write shop to revise the E-EAFM June 2019 and subsequent updating of all materials
- A peer-to-peer workshop in the Philippines to exchange experiences in applying EAFM in the Philippines, 8 – 12 September 2019 in Iloilo and 13 September 2019 in Manila
- 3. Workshop on capacity building for trainers in Bangkok 9-11 October 2019
- 4. A pilot trial for the revised E-EAFM materials in Phnom Penh 16-20 December 2019.

Future planned activities in the program included:

 Capacity building workshop (WS) for SEAFDEC staff on management tools for most commonly identified EAFM issues (tentatively 20-24 April 2020)

Objectives

- 1. For SEAFDEC-TD to learn more about management tools for EAFM; and
- Finalize the revised SEAFDEC E-EAFM training materials.

Outputs and outcomes

- Awareness and increased familiarity of fisheries management tools for EAFM among core SEAFDEC-TD staff.
- 2. A finalized version of the Management tool booklet.
- Increased effectiveness of SEAFDEC-TD staff to technically support partner countries in EAFM implementation and management activities.
