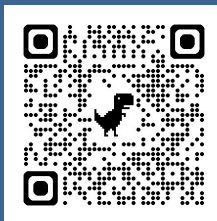

IMCS Network's Capacity Development

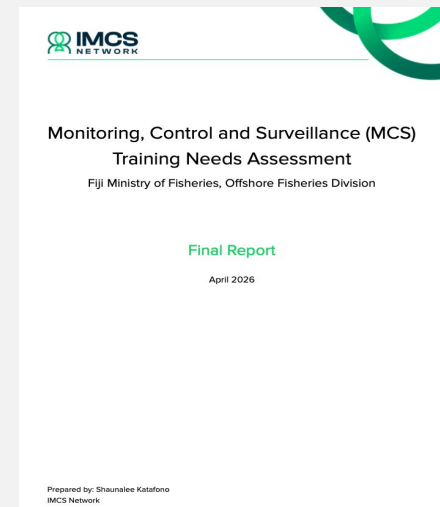
Capacity Development is not a single activity — it is a connected set of efforts that build individual and collective capability across the community:

IMCS Network's Technical Assistance

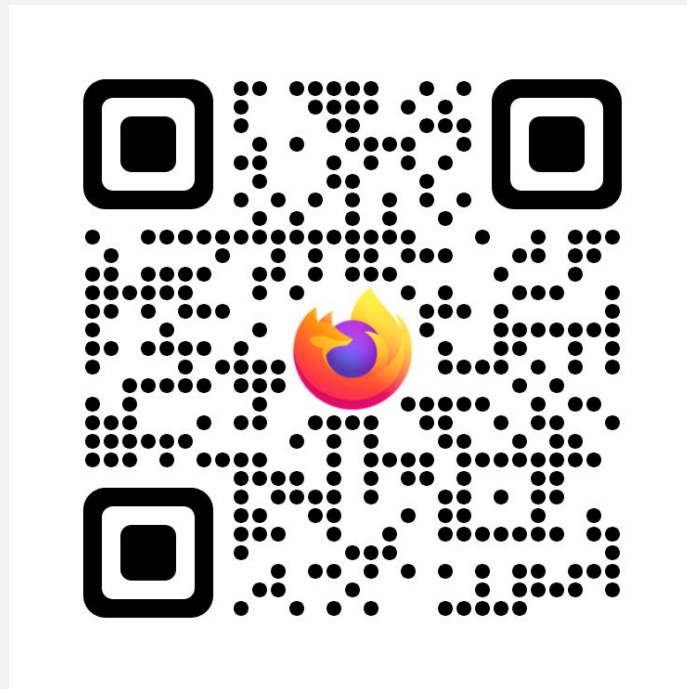
Alongside training and peer exchange, we provide direct technical assistance tailored to national needs — for example:

- Identify vessels authorised to fish in multiple RFMOs and RFBs.
- Compare RFMO or RFB records for a specific vessel and identify differences between these records.
- Search vessel company, owners and operator.
