

Illegal Fishing

 Fishing activities conducted in contravention of applicable laws and regulations including binding conservation measures of regional or international commissions



Illegal Fishing

 Fishing activities conducted in contravention of applicable laws and regulations including binding conservation measures of regional or international commissions

- Examples
 - Using an unauthorized gear type
 - Fishing in another country's Exclusive Economic Zone without permission



Unreported Fishing



Unreported Fishing

 Fishing activities that are not reported or are misreported to relevant authorities in contravention of national laws and regulations, or reporting procedures of an regional fisheries management organization



Unreported Fishing

- Fishing activities that are not reported or are misreported to relevant authorities in contravention of national laws and regulations, or reporting procedures of an regional fisheries management organization
- Examples
 - Not reporting or misreporting catches
 - Reporting lower value species as higher value species



Unregulated Fishing



Unregulated Fishing

 Fishing activities that occur in areas or for fish stocks for which there are no applicable conservation or management measures or fishing activities that undermine efforts to conserve marine species and ecosystems



Unregulated Fishing

 Fishing activities that occur in areas or for fish stocks for which there are no applicable conservation or management measures or fishing activities that undermine efforts to conserve marine species and ecosystems

- Examples
 - Non member vessel fishing within the convention area when there is no regulation pertaining to a species
