
What are RFMOs?

 International bodies that are comprised of countries that share fishing resources

Play a critical role in fisheries on the high sea and/or deep

sea in a particular geographic region

 Ensure the long-term conservation and sustainable use of shared fish stocks in the areas which these resources occur

Regional Management Fishing Organizations (RFMOs)


How do RFMOs function? Emphasis on:

- **Specialization:** Committees addressing: Science, Management, Enforcement, etc
- Process: As with other matters, IUU listings are the result of formalized steps for consideration of violations and ultimate dissemination of listings - often not a quick turnaround endeavor
- Consensus:
 - Informal bargaining involving individual members or coalitions may drive results
 - Matters involving IUU listings can be highly contentious and a challenge to consensus



RFMOs

Some RFMOs may manage all of the fish stocks found within a specific geographic region.






RFMOs

Other RFMOs manage highly-migratory species (HMS), mainly tuna, throughout a region:

- International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT)
- Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission (IATTC)
- Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC)
- Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC)
- Commission for the Conservation of Southern Bluefin Tuna (CCSBT)



Regional Fishery Bodies





States have a duty to cooperate in the conservation and management of high seas and highly migratory fish stocks:

- RFMOs provide a mechanism for that cooperation
- Measures are binding to members
- Non-members have a duty to cooperate





- Promote international cooperation among fishing nations
- Promote effective and responsible marine stewardship
- Manage shared fish stocks
- Monitor fishing activities globally



SPRFMO Meeting



- Ensure sustainable fisheries management
- Incorporate monitoring, control and surveillance (MCS) measures.
- Combat illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing



Monitoring, Control and Surveillance (MCS) Measures

- Authorized vessel lists
- IUU vessel lists
- VMS
- Boarding and inspection
- Landing restrictions
- Transshipment restrictions
- Reporting requirements



Conservation and Management Measures (CMM) Examples

- Daily catch reporting
- FAD closures
- Tuna CMMs
- Tuna-like species CMMs
- Observer programs
- Prohibited species

Regional Vessel Register

Database of all registered vessels within a RFMO. May include:

- either all vessels authorized to undertake certain activities in all or a portion of the Convention area,
- or may be limited to vessels above a certain size or those authorized to retain certain species onboard, etc.




Boarding and Inspection Requirements

- Some RFMOs may have CMMs that pertain to both high seas boarding inspections (HSBI) and/or port inspections
- Port inspections CMMs often include similar requirements (if not identical) to that of the Port State Measures Agreement:
 - Designated ports
 - Prior notification of arrival
 - Port inspection requirements
 - Port inspection procedure guidelines
 - Procedure in the event of apparent infringements



Vessel Monitoring System (VMS)

- Includes VMS transmission and reporting requirements
- Lists type approved transceiver units
- May provide VMS standard operating procedures





Transshipment

- General rules
- General provisions
- Record of authorized vessels to receive transshipped products
- At-sea transshipments monitoring programs
- At-sea transshipments requirements (may require an Regional Observer Program)



Transshipment

- In-port transshipments requirements
- Prohibitions (unless granted an exemption) or conditions for transshipment activities with specific vessel types
- Required transshipment declaration information
- Reporting requirements





Fishing Prohibitions

- Prohibition of fishing on data buoys
- Fishing within 1 nm of or interacting with a data buoy in any of the following manners:
 - Encircling the buoy with fishing gear
 - Tying up to or attaching the vessel, or any fishing gear, part or portion of the vessel, to a data buoy or its mooring line
 - Cutting a data buoy anchor





Regional Observer Program (ROP)

- Establishes the ROP.
- Provides the scope, objectives, and operational guidelines of the ROP.
- Establishes the responsibilities of the observers operating under the ROP.
- Sets observer coverage requirements.
- Establishes observer rights, safety, and responsibilities.





Daily Catch and Effort Reporting

- Increases transparency
- Requires vessels (of a specific size) be subject to a data recording system.
- Provides catch reporting guidelines for vessels operating within the Convention Area
 - Vessel requirements for maintaining an accurate written or electronic log
 - Information required to be included in an accurate written or electronic log



Shark CMMs

- May require full utilization or retention of all parts of the shark until landing or transshipment.
- Prohibits retaining on board, transshipping, landing, or trading any fins harvested in contravention of the RFMO.
- Prohibits retaining onboard, transshipping landing, storing, selling, or offering for sale any part or whole carcass of certain shark species
- WCPFC 2019-04; IOTC 13/05 and 13/06





Shark CMMs

- Requires the prompt release of (unharmed) specific shark species when brought alongside the vessel.
- May require documentation of the number of discards and releases of certain shark species through the ROP.
- Addresses by-catch and encourages the release of live sharks, especially juveniles, that are caught incidentally

Example CMMs that may Lead to Violations in IOTC, and WCPFC

Example Violations

- Assault, resist, intimidate, sexually harass, interfere with or unduly obstruct or delay an authorized inspector
- Intentionally tampering with or disabling VMS
- Other such violations as may be determined by the Commission after such violations are included and circulated (published)



Example Violations

- Using prohibited fishing gear (e.g., large scale driftnets)
- Falsifying or intentionally concealing markings, identification or registration of a vessel
- Concealing, tampering or disposing of evidence relating to an investigation of any violation
- Multiple violations which taken together show a serious disregard of applicable CMMs
- Refusal to accept a boarding and inspection



Addressing Non-compliance

- IUU vessel Lists
- Restrictions on port entry or access to port services for IUU vessels
- Import restrictions
- Compliance evaluation
- Capacity building
- Compliance Monitoring Scheme



Enforcement

Requires coordination, collaboration, and information exchange among the:

- Flag State
- Coastal State
- Port State
- Market State
